Loose-Leaf Services

These are compiled by private publishers on a subject basis. They are designed to help practitioners to stay current on legal, legislative, regulatory, and policy developments, particularly in heavily regulated practice areas like securities, benefits, and tax. They were originally published in ring binders for easy updating (hence the term “loose leaf”), but most are now available electronically.

Proposed Legislation or Regulation

Thomas <http://www.thomas.gov/>

Thomas is the best tool for tracking pending legislation. You can search for legislation in the current Congress by keyword, bill number, or sponsor. You can search in previous Congresses by keyword or public law number.

Lexis and **Westlaw** also have tracking functions, though Thomas is typically more up to date.

House and Senate Committee websites frequently have information about pending legislation. However, committees are not required to post or update this information, so the content and the currency of the sites vary widely. The following committees are involved with environmental matters:

Proposed regulations are announced in the Federal Register, available at <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/fr/index.html>. New laws and proposed regulations may also be listed on administrative agency websites, but this varies by agency and is not always kept up to date. Websites for nonprofit and “watch dog” groups may also track new legislation or regulations.

Comments on proposed regulations can be found at Regulations.gov, <http://www.regulations.gov>, a multi-agency clearinghouse for collecting public comment on proposed regulations

Always update statutes and regulations by consulting the pocket parts (U.S.C.) or the List of Sections Affected (C.F.R.). The **Westlaw Key Cite** system will also flag pending changes to the U.S.C. and the C.F.R. and link to updating laws or regulations.

Legislative History

Legislative histories have already been compiled for many federal laws. Check a standard reference, such as the *Union List of Legislative Histories* (Reserve, KF4.U551)

or the *CIS Legislative History Service* (Reserve, KF49.C63). Alternatively, do a keyword search of the library catalog, for example – “(clean air act) and (legislative history).”

In addition to the sources listed above, use **Thomas** (recent legislation only), **USCCAN** (U.S. Code Congressional and Administrative News) (available in print, First Floor, after Statutes at Large, and on Westlaw) and **Lexis Congressional > Congressional Publications database** for legislative history research. You will need the **Public Law** or **Bill** number to do research using these sources.

Finally, consult Congressional Committee websites, listed above, and **CQ** (Congressional Quarterly) resources, available through the Library’s website, for additional information.

State Law Research

State codes and case law are available through **Lexis** and **Westlaw**. Print materials, including state and regional reporters, are available on the second floor of the library.

Laws and Regulations for selected states are available from **CCH Health & Human Resources Internet Research Network – Environmental Compliance** and from **BNA**

State Environment & Safety Regulatory Monitoring Report and State Environment Daily.

State legislative history research can be challenging. Most state legislatures post the text and status of current legislation on their websites. For older materials, use **Westlaw > U.S. State Materials > Legislative Histories.**

States also vary in publishing practices for regulations and administrative materials. Administrative codes and decisions are available in state databases on **Lexis** and **Westlaw**. Other useful databases include:

Current Index to Legal Periodicals

Update LegalTrac and ILP research by viewing most recent weeks' issues. Available in HTML, Word, and PDF. Organized by journal title and area of law. Accessible through Pence Law Library Website.

Index to Foreign Legal Periodicals

Journal articles covering topics in foreign and international law from 1985 to present. The index is in English, although the majority of publications covered are not. Accessible through Pence Law Library Website.

Articles before 1983 can be very useful if you are interested in the policy concerns underlying a piece of environmental legislation. You will need to consult the **Index to Legal Periodicals** in print, located on the second floor, in the Periodicals section. Articles will be available through **HeinOnline**, **JSTOR**, or in print (through Pence Library or ILL). Please ask a reference librarian for assistance.
